# How was the Boomerang made?


 The Boomerang were made from a single piece of carved wood, they use all the trees to make it. The person who made it heated the wood and then bent it to get the right shape. Today some people still make it the same or buy it at the shops.

 They are used the Boomerang for weapons for hunting birds such as the emu, kangaroo and other animals for eating. You can throw it straight and it will come back for you and then if you aim for the bird you will hit and It will probably be dead.

• They are used the same, like they did before. They are still used for hunting birds.

• The Boomerang was used by all the Aboriginal groups but they exchanged the Boomerang for other things, so that means that all the aboriginal groups have used it.


