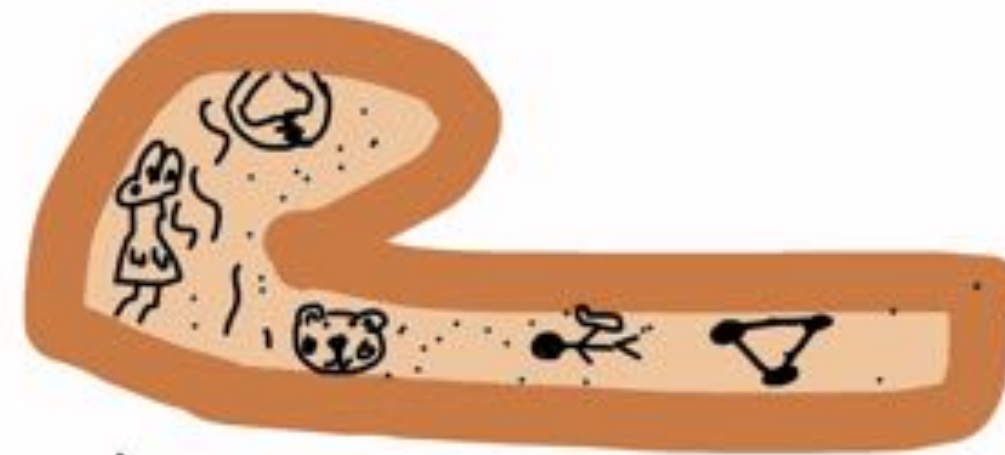


WHAT IS IT

IT IS A HAND MADE TOOL USED TO KILL ANIMALS FOR FOOD. NORMALLY FOR KANGAROO MEAT , BIRD FEATHERS AND MANY MORE.

IT HAS A STRANGE SHAPE IN MY OPINION IT LOOKS LIKE A KANGAROOS PAW.

IT IS MADE FROM A RED RIVER GUM TREE THE RED RIVER GUM TREE IS ONE OF AUSTRALIAS MOST ICONIC EYUCALIPTS.

**IT IS MADE FROM THE RED RIVER GUMTREE
THIS TREE IS ENDEMIC TO AUSTRALIA. IT HAS SMOOTH
CREAMY BARK. THE COLOUR IS WHITE AND GREY. THE RED
RIVER GUMTREE WAS FOUND IN MURRAY DARLING BASIN.**

A BUNDI TAKES 3 DAYS TO MAKE, AND IT IS USED TO TAKE DOWN ANIMALS

A BUNDI IS USED AS A DIGGING AND HITTING STICK AS WELL AS A THROWING STICK TO BRING DOWN ANIMALS THESE ARE NOT MASS MADE TOOL IT IS A SPECIALLY MADE TOOL BY THE ABORIGINALS.
