What Is It?

This tool is an Aboriginal Australian hardwood club. This hunting stick is used for a hard, deadly weapon or as a throwing stick for hunting animals. This is mainly used for hunting to bring food home and when the Aboriginals found further use as punishing people who disobeyed the Aboriginal law. This weapon is so hard it could break a skull! It is the shape of a golf club used now a day!

What is it made of?

This weapon is made out of super hard and carved timber wood off timber trees. It is made out of this wood because it is hard but easy to carve. It is good Timber wood has its advantages in carving so it can really help.

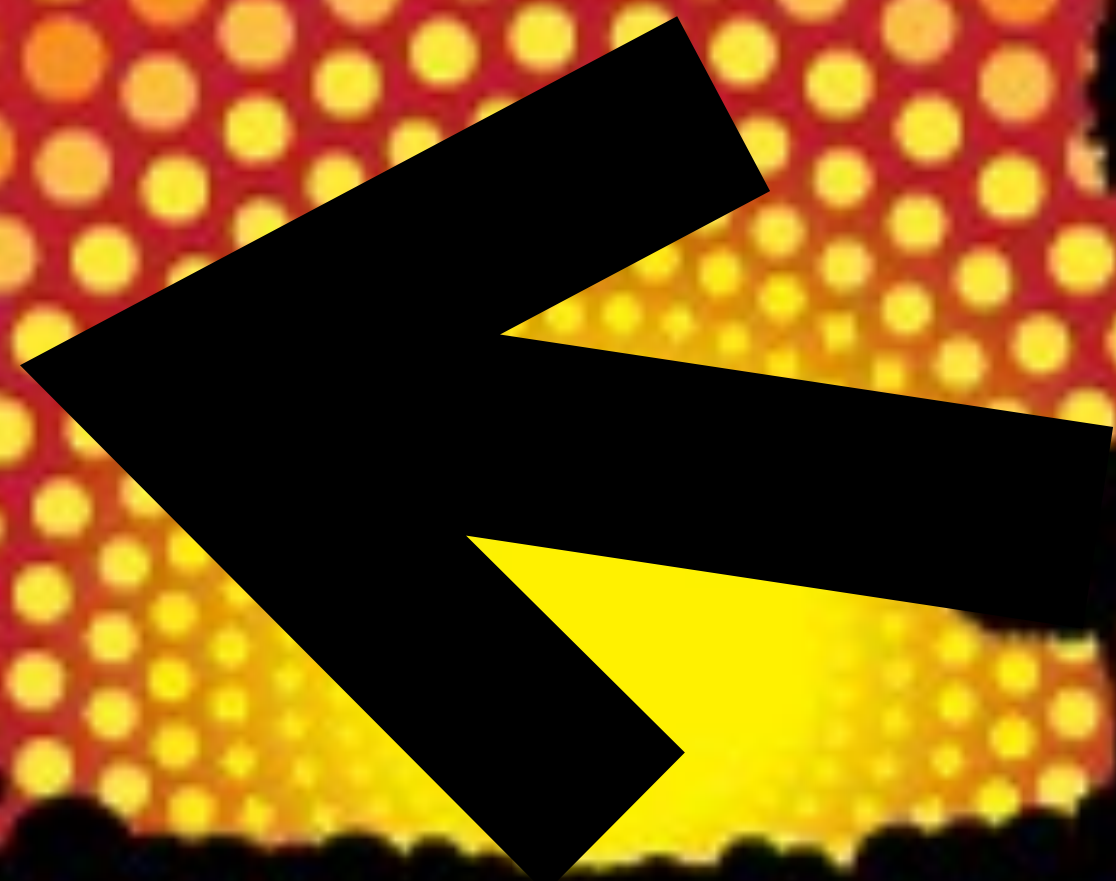
