Cathy was only 17 when she won her first gold medal. When Cathy was 27 she got to light the flame at the Olympics in Sydney. Cathy re married after her ex husband died. Cathy hade her first child in 2011. She was a runner all her life and had no other occupation. She has a 10 year old daughter.

Cathy won her first gold medal when she was just 16 years old. One year Cathy tied third.

Cathy inspired lots of young athletes. Cathy has her own organisation and got Australia on the Olympic scale. Cathy carried Australian and Aboriginal flag. She is the co-founder of the Cathy Freeman foundation and continues to help Torres Strait Islander and Aboriginal children at school.
