

Benn Harradine

Benn Harradine is a proud Indigenous man from the Watjabaluk Wergia Harradine made his Olympic debut in 2006 to be a discus thrower for Australia. He is the first person to stand for Australia in a field event and he is one of three Indigenous people to go to three Olympic Games the others are Cathy Freeman and Patty Mills. He was born on the fourteenth of October 1982

He grow up in Lake Macquarie the suburb Eleebana in New South Wales where he loved to play sport. At the age of eight he started discus as he got older he enjoyed it increasingly. His parents are Beth Harradine and Ken Harradine he loved his dad and mum so much he said this about them "I was and still am very fortunate to have parents that did everything for my brother and me."

Benn Harradine used to be a professional trainer and a track and field athlete now he is a amazing Australian Olympic athlete he has done very very well for Australia and has got lots and lots of medals for Australia he has done so well

Benn Harradine has made it to the Olympics Games in 2008, 2012 and 2016 he also has been in the commonwealth games in 2006, 2010, 2014 and 2018. In 2010 he got a gold medal at the commonwealth games because he threw a discus 65.20 meters, he made it to the championships in 2011, 2013, 2015 and 2017. He also has the record for longest discus throw for an Australian witch is 68.20 meters and after all that Benn Harradine's net worth is 1.5 million dollars! Benn harradine retired in 2018
