He was on the show "The great outdoors", for 16 years from 1993 to 2009. He narrated the first Australian segment for the Olympic game opening ceremony. He is best known for the feature film, "Bran Nue Dae". He has 4 kids that are known as Willara, Zoe, Alyssa and Jurra.

He is well known for being an actor, tv presenter, a teacher, promoter and a comedian. He is on a well known Australian series. He is in Heart Land, Crocodile Dundee in Los Angeles, The Fringe Dwellers, Blackfellas, Clowning Around, The Echo of Thunder, A Waltz Through the Hills, Clowning Around 2 Australia Day and much more.
