Food

Shelter

Shelter They would use leaves and twigs to make a shelter. The aboriginals didn't have bricks like us. The aboriginals didn't have beautiful houses like us. The fire that the Aboriginals made got rid of Mosquitoes. Aboriginal housing mostly consisted of simple shelters.



Transport

the aboriginal people traveled in canoes made out of tree trunks. The aboriginals road animals to travel. Aboriginals did not have cars. These canoes were very helpful in fishing





activities as well as for travelling around.

Clothing

The aboriginals often use bark leaves and grass. The aboriginals rarely wore clothes in parts of Australia. The Aboriginals mostly just had paintings on their body. There aboriginals wore possum cloaks when it was cold.

The men would wear riji and this was an item of clothing that went around their waist.
