


What is it?

- For my aboriginal invention I'm doing a humpy
- Without a house the aboriginals would not survive.
- They also needed it to stay away from any wild animals or things that can eat them.



What is it made of?

- Usually their house are made from mud, sticks, or bark.
- Different aboriginal tribes use different material to make their houses.
- They would also need to make the houses stronger because they had different weather.



How was it made?

- It was made when pieces of bark or leaves have fallen onto the ground and the aboriginal people can breach it.
- The aboriginal people make their houses different sizes for their family.
- Some tribes make small groups of people because they have lots of people in a family.



What is it used for?

The house is used for sleeping and storage. The aboriginal people needed a house to live so that they can sleep peacefully. Sometimes they put soft bark on the floor so that when they sleep it is like a bed.



What do we use today?

We still use a house to stay safe but we have bigger houses that can fit more people. We also have better thing like beds and pools.

It was used by all tribes because they needed to stay safe. Most tribes made tents, but in different tribes they use other models.
