ART

MUSIC

TRANSPORT

Indigenous people would use wood from trees to build a raft so they can travel across the ocean they would usually build a lot of them for a whole tribe. They would also make canoes out of hollow tree trunk from



there closest forest or woods. they would only build rafts if they live close to the ocean. The canoes were very helpful to those who were fisherman and for people who want to go for a swim. But aboriginals are nomads which means they would go to place to place on foot and they travel all around the place.

FOOD

Indigenous people for food they would eat all sorts of animals like fish, turtle and bush tucker.

Indigenous people would use their spears, throwing sticks and homemade fishing rods to hunt and catch



stuff. They would also make their own slow cooker if they need to go somewhere and hunt this is how they make it they would make the fire then they would put clay rocks and then there food then they would put more clay rocks then they would put fire and then they would cover it with dirt, grass and leaves. The women would cook, pick plants and pick the bush tucker. The men would hunt for the more bigger animals with boomerangs, sticks, bark and much more.



SHELTER

For indigenous shelter they would use tree branches, bark and leaves to make a nice cosy shelter they would also use wood from trees for a more strong shelter. They would live in caves for there proper house and they would paint on the walls for fun and entertainment. To cover the house they would use leaves for the front wall they would keep a fire inside the cave to stay warm and that was what the leaves were for at the front were for. They would also use paper bark for a bed believe it or not they would think it was comfortable! To make the fire they would get a thin piece of bark and a slim stick and a piece of grass they would spin the slim stick in the bark and the bark would be on the grass and then you spin the stick in the bark and it creates fire in the grass then you put the grass with the fire in the actual big fire.
