

Patrick Dodson is a chairman councillor for Aboriginal reconciliation. Patrick was born on January 29th 1948 and is aged 74. He was born in Broome, Western Australia but went to school in Melbourne at Corpus Christ College. Soon after school he studied the priesthood and later became the first Aboriginal priest. Patrick's full name is Patrick Lionel Drargun Dodson.

Early life/family background

In his family background Patrick has one brother Mick Dodson who succeeded too. Sadly Patrick's parents died when Patrick and his brother Mick were both young so they became orphans together. Patrick's brother Mick was the winner of the Australian of the year prize in 2009 and also a national Indigenous Australian leader. Patrick did not have any wife's or any kids.

Adulthood and awards

His awards are the winner of the Sydney Peace prize in 2008. A year after that Patrick won the John Curtis Medal. Then in 2010 on the second of March Patrick was announced as a Labor senator for Western Australia. Patrick Dodson did lots of things. He started by being a consultant then a priest and a councillor. He is a Yawuru elder and a Labor senator.

Patrick has had many different jobs because he was successful. Patrick was a priest and chairman and his biggest achievement was winning the Sydney Peace prize and the John Curtis medal in 2008 and in 2009. Patrick Dodson is still alive at the age of 74 and has had an interesting life. He is currently still the chairman of the Council for Aboriginal Reconciliation.
