Evonne Goolagong was a female famous tennis player. She was born on the 31st of July 1951. She grew up in Riverina district of New South Wales. Evonne was in a poor but happy family.

Evonne was eight years old when she started tennis. When Evonne was 13 years old her coach Vic Edwards persuaded her parents to let him coach her in Sydney. So she had to move away from her family to live in Sydney with her coach. It wasn't soon until she won enough awards to turn into a professional tennis player in 1979.

Evonne had seven siblings and she was the third born out of the eight. Her parents were Kenny and Melinda Goolagong. Her dad was a farmer and her mum would stay home, clean and look after her eight kids. She lived on the farm her dad worked on.

When Evonne moved to Sydney she attended Willoughby girls only High school, and finished her time at high school in 1968. After high school was over she went to Secretarial Studies at Metropolitan Business Collage.

Now Evonne is an advocate for her native peoples rights. She is an Ambassador for the game of tennis. Evonne is a Wiradjuri person and her totem is a kangaroo. She is married to Roger Cawley and had two kids.
