WHAT WAS IT MADE OF?

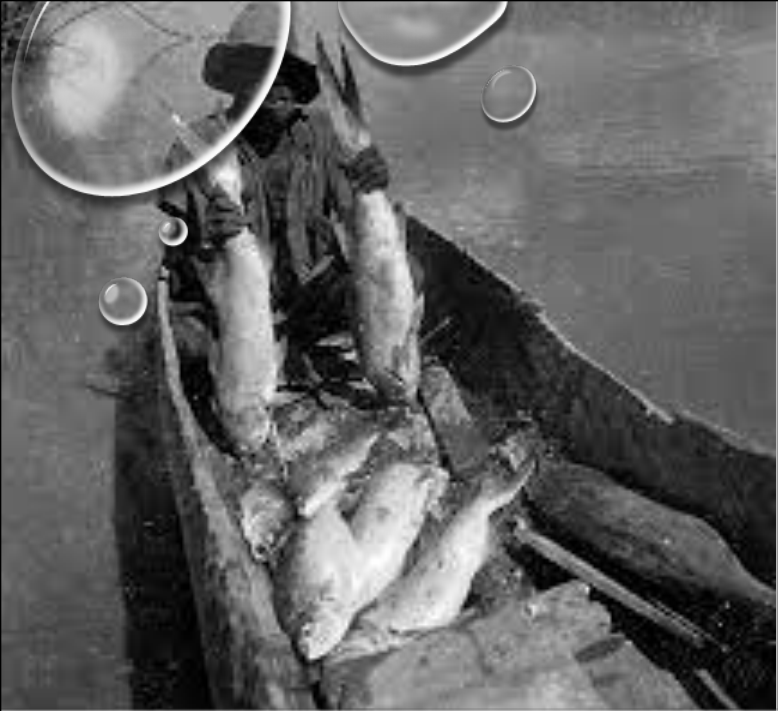
HOW DID IT WORK

- THE ABORIGINALS MADE UP THE WALLS UP IN A RIVER OR LAKE THEN THEY'D BUILD UP THE WALLS AND WAIT, THE FISH THEN SWAM PAST THE WALL AND STAY THERE FOR A BIT THEN WHEN THE TIDE CAME IN THE FISH WOULDN'T BE ABLE TO SWIM OUT OF THE WALLS THEN THE ABORIGINALS WOULD CATCH THE FISH AND EAT THEM.

- THE ABORIGINAL FISH TRAP WAS USED AND TRAP FISH FOR A FOOD SUPPLY SO THEY WOULDN'T STARVE. THE ABORIGINALS USUALLY PUT THE TRAPS IN THE RIVER AND LAKES

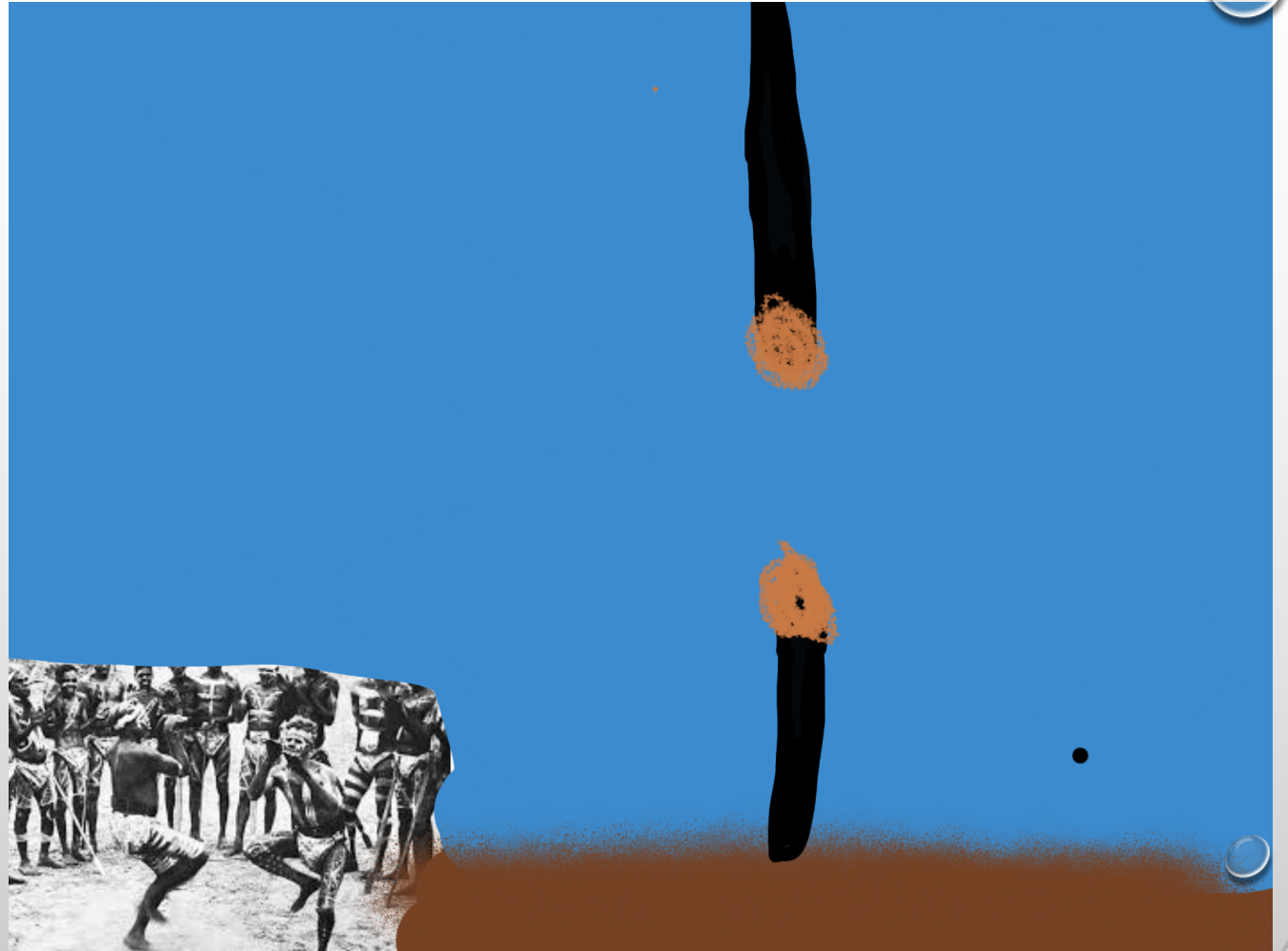
HOW WAS IT MADE?

- THE ABORIGINALS MADE UP THE WALLS WITH ROCKS AND STUCK THEM TOGETHER WITH MUD UP HIGH THEN MADE A LITTLE PATH FOR THE FISH TO SWIM PAST AND GET STUCK.



DID OTHER ABORIGINAL LANGUAGE GROUPS USE IT?

- THE ABORIGINAL FISH TRAP WAS ONLY USED BY ONE GROUP THAT GROUP WAS THE NGEMBA PEOPLE OF BREWARRINA.



WHAT DO PEOPLE USE TODAY FOR THE SAME PURPOSE?

- PEOPLE THESE DAYS USE BOATS, CAST NETS, NETS, SPEAR FISHING AND FISHING RODS. BECAUSE IT IS A MUCH EFFICIENT WAY TO GET FISH.
