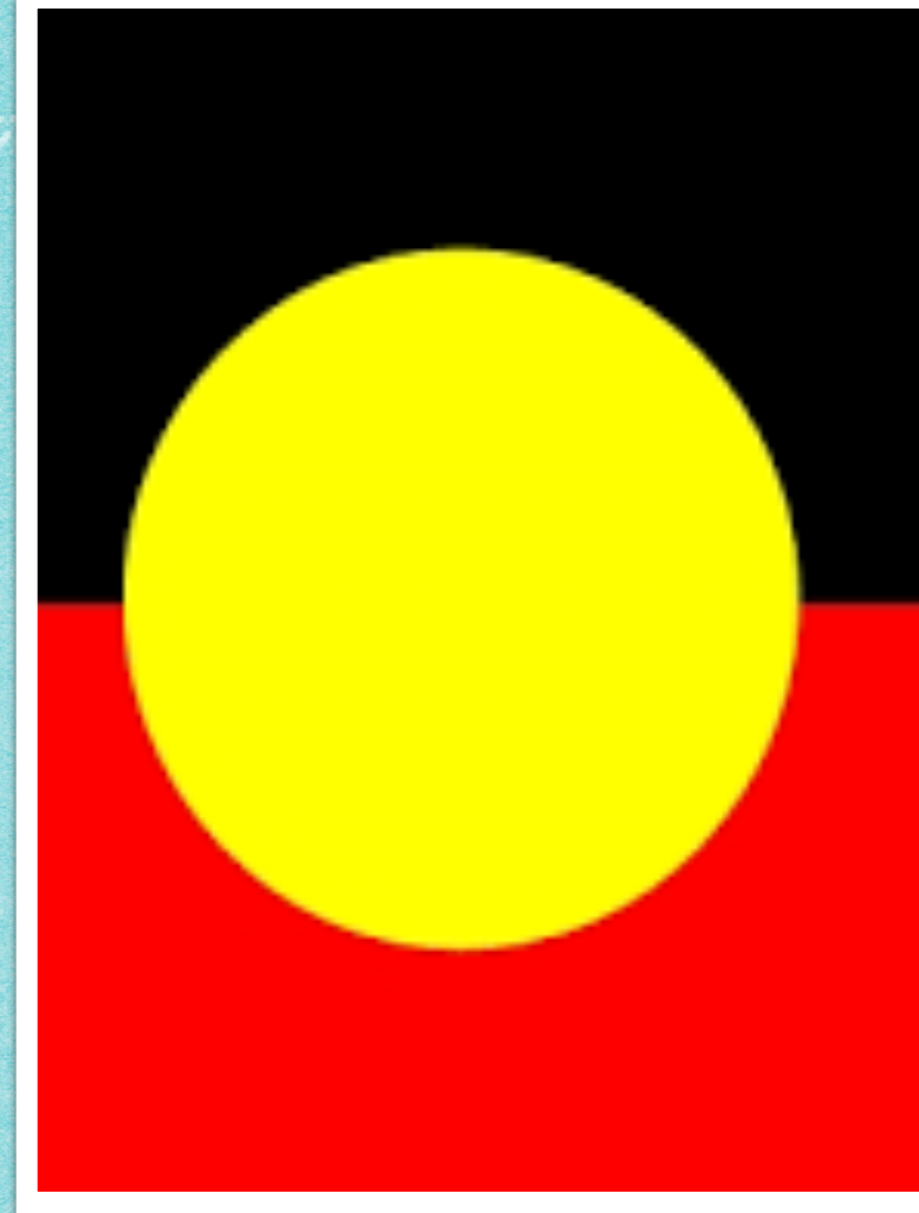
What is a spear?



A spear is a weapon with a pointed tip. Often made of steel. The aboriginals used to use spears to survive and kill predators. Or sometimes kill animals for food. A spear is very long, about 6–8 feet long. It can also be used to stab or slash.

What was it used for?

The spear has been used throughout human history both as a hunting and fishing tool and as a weapon. It can kill and shoot. It is commonly used for killing for food



How was it made?

wooden spears were made with fire-hardened points. The handle is made of wood. They either use stone or burn wood to make the point on top.



What is it made from?

A spear is shaft, usually of wood with a pointer made of steel or carved wood. They often carved the wood with another piece of bark,
