
Spear

• A spear is a pole weapon consisting of a shaft, usually of wood, with a pointed head. The head may be simply the sharpened end of the shaft itself, as is the case with fire hardened spears, or it may be made of a more durable material fastened to the shaft, such as bone, flint, obsidian, iron, steel, or bronze.

What is it made of.

• A spear is usually made of shaft and wood the top bit of the spear is the bit that is made of rock or shaft, the bit at the bottom is the bit that the hunters will use to hold on and then throw, this is usually mad of wood.





How to make it

• You need to get a decent sized Rock it has to be strong, the rock has to be around fifty centimetres long. After that you need to sharpen it. Secondly you need to find a long skinny stick and attach it to the rock, and there you have your first spear.

The spear (Woomera) was used to hunt for food and to get things for the community they were living.

• In aboriginal the spear was called the (WOOMERA) it was traditionally used to hunt and kill animals to cook and eat food.
