Growing up as an First Australian it must have been hard to be respected.

Growing up he had 2 parents who were both First Australians, his dad from the Bagaarrmugu region and his mum from the Guggu Yalanji region (which is in Queensland). His brother Gerhardt Pearson is a who is a achiever as well. He has a wife called Tracey Kluck. He has 2 children called Charlie and Melita Pearson. His personal life is a roller-coaster! He is 56 years of age. He went to Sydney University while going to primary and high school in Hope Vale. In August 2012 he revealed that he had undergone four months of chemotherapy for lymphatic cancer. Now don't you want to know how many awards has.
